Town Clerk Carolyn Renko read the legal notice that appeared in the Star Gazette and posted on the Town Bulletin Board and the Town Website and opened the public hearing for comment.

There was no public comment, therefore the public hearing was closed at 6:08 p.m.

Supervisor Roman commented the following on the 2026 budget:

The Town continues to control spending through shared services, staffing levels, and a heightened emphasis on all expenses. There is a slight property tax increase, based near the CPI, to offset continued increases in expenses resulting from overall factors in the economy. These impact the Town in areas such as labor, contracts, health care, highway equipment and operations, and the maintenance and service of buildings and properties. The Town also maintains a conservative approach to all revenue streams with a focus on creating a balanced budget with the goal of increasing fund balances.

Council Member Williams commented on the Library District.

Council Member Mathews made a motion, Council Member Steed seconded to adjourn the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:10 p.m.
